



Youth Conservation Corps (YCC) Crew Member

Job Description

The 30 Mile River Watershed Association (30MRWA) is seeking members for our Youth Conservation Corps (YCC) for the 2018 summer season. The purpose of the YCC is to protect and improve water quality in our lakes through completing projects that reduce erosion and sources of polluted stormwater runoff. Projects might include planting vegetation buffers, stabilizing shoreline with riprap, ditching roadsides, seeding and mulching. Rewards include training in water quality issues; the satisfaction of providing a valuable service to your community; and a fun, outdoor, summer work experience.

Responsibilities:

- Perform physically demanding outdoor labor on a daily basis.
- Complete work thoroughly and efficiently, with attention to safety.
- Attend training events as requested.
- Provide own transportation to job sites and be willing to carpool when possible to sites throughout the watershed.

Qualifications:

- A positive attitude and ability to work hard as a team member.
- Ability to perform physical labor in sometimes difficult conditions.
- Willingness to learn the procedures and importance of YCC projects and an interest in environmental stewardship.
- Ability to communicate with crew members and the program director.

The program will run for approximately six weeks in June-August, with three seven-hour days per week. Pay starts at \$10.00/hour. This position may be combined with the courtesy boat inspector position for full-time work.
