It's Boat Inspection Season

Summer is Here!

Our Courtesy Boat Inspectors (CBIs) are back in action! You will find us at boat launches throughout the watershed through mid-September, on Androscoggin Lake, Parker Pond and Flying Pond. Our goal is to prevent the spread of invasive plants by working with boaters to inspect their watercraft before entering and after leaving the water.



If you visit any of these beautiful locations, you may see one of our CBIs (wearing a yellow shirt) approach with a clipboard (for collecting data) to talk to you about where you went boating last and how to thoroughly inspect your watercraft and equipment. The inspection will take only a couple of minutes, but this quick interaction can make a world of difference in preventing the spread of invasive aquatic plants.

Summer Volunteers Needed


Be a part of our summer preservation efforts



Each summer, volunteer Courtesy Boat Inspectors (CBIs), Invasive Plant Patrollers (IPPs), and Water Quality Monitors play critical roles in protecting our lakes. CBIs inspect boats at launches for invasive plant fragments and serve as friendly educators to the boating community, while IPPs survey our lakes for invasive aquatic plants. Water quality monitors assist us in collecting data on water clarity, temperature, and oxygen levels, which help indicate the health of a lake. This year we are also looking for experienced kayakers to assist in our new kayaking program. Training is provided for all these positions.

Kayak Adventures


Programs for Everyone!


